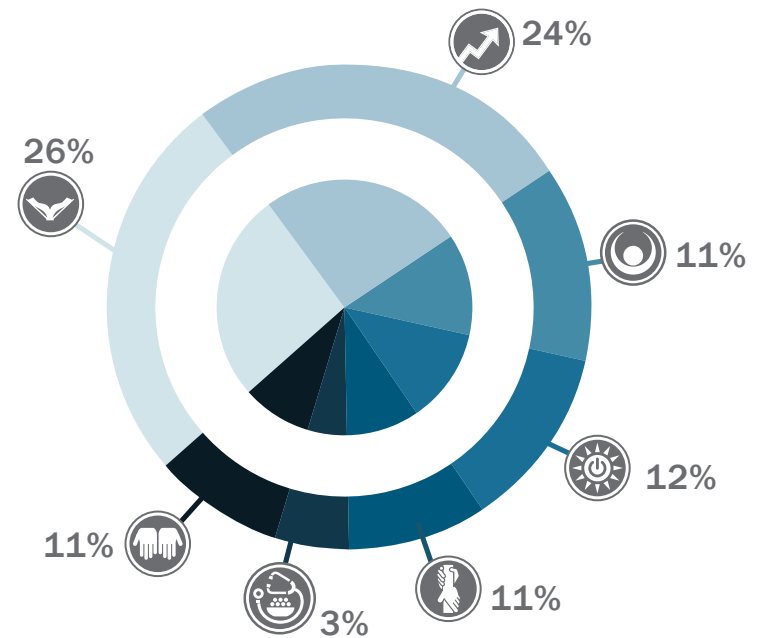
# OUR HISTORY

Thanks to the generosity of our friends, volunteers, donors, and supporters, we have grown from 20 Fellows at the end of 2011 to **more than 230 Resolution Fellows** today. These Fellows are working in 20 U.S. states and more than 60 countries, developing innovative approaches and sustainable solutions to pressing global issues. They are driving progress in their communities, and their efforts have benefitted **more than 600,000 people** thus far—making each Resolution Fellow a change agent and a force for good.

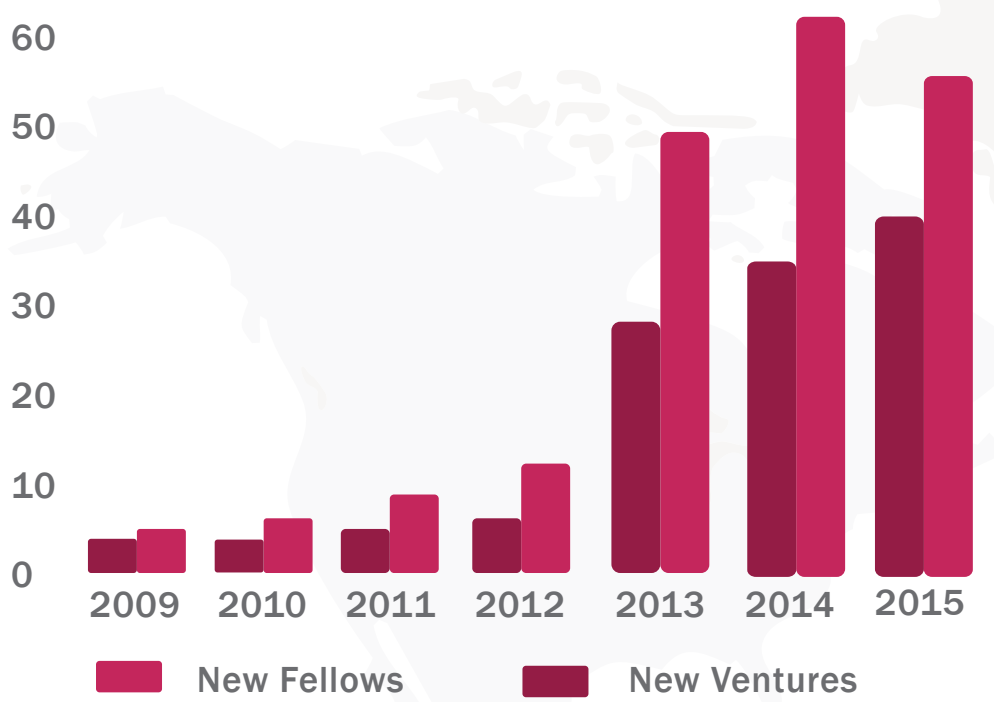

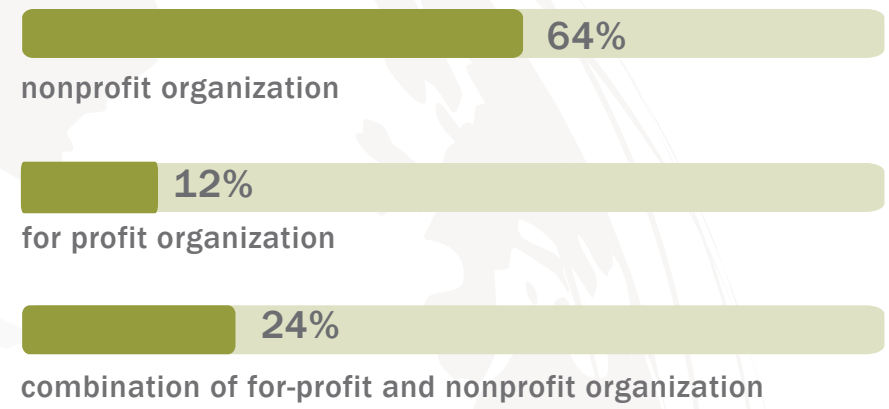

# FELLOW SPOTLIGHTS

## José Martín Solórzano González - BuildingHealth



### About the Fellow:

José Martín Solórzano González is a native of Chiapas, Mexico. He studied medicine at Universidad Autónoma de Chiapas and became the first doctor in his community. In 2013, the Mexican government elected Martín as the Mexican youth delegate for the United Nations. Martín currently serves as a doctor in his community, where he provides first-level health care to the rural community. He is also the president of Iniciativa Construyendo Salud A.C., an ONG that improves the quality of life for vulnerable people in Mexico.

### The Issue and His Resolution:

Chiapas is a densely populated region in Mexico inhabited by several communities of indigenous people. Poverty, inadequate education, and insufficient access to quality health care result in high rates of disease and malnutrition. Martín founded BuildingHealth to improve the quality of life for these vulnerable communities. His venture provides basic health care, such as free medical services, medication, and telemedicine services to impoverished and underserved families, with a focus on youth. By providing these services, Martín and his team are working to reduce the number of deaths from preventable diseases, reduce the number of children with malnutrition, and contribute to the overall reduction of extreme poverty levels in the region.

### How We Help:

Martín is supported by his two Resolution Guides, Sebastian Rodriguez-Llamazares and Adita Desai. Sebastian is a physician and the chief innovative officer at salauno, a social enterprise that is devoted to eliminating unnecessary blindness in Mexico. Adita works as an analyst at the Marwood Group, a consultant firm focused on health care. With their expertise, they guided Martín on the logistics of his social venture, offered him advice on how to make his social venture sustainable in the long term, and gave him tips for funding. The team is specifically focused on supporting Martín in the design of his evaluation tool for measuring the impact of his program on target populations.

## Maxwell Chinnah, Godwin Attigah, and Megan Weichers - TerraOak



### About the Fellows:

Maxwell, Godwin, and Megan are recent graduates of Wartburg College. Maxwell majored in computer science and minored in graphic design, Godwin studied computer and information sciences and support, and Megan majored in business administration. Maxwell and Godwin are passionate about bringing clean energy products to emerging countries and together started TerraOak Inc., a company that aims to provide sustainable solutions to energy challenges. Their first initiative, TerraOak, was their Resolution-supported social venture.

### The Issue and Their Resolution:

Maxwell, Godwin, and Megan founded TerraOak, a social venture that aims to bring efficient solar box-cookers to the Ashanti region of Ghana. They hope to mitigate the deaths caused by indoor air pollution from cooking. Through the Genesys, a prototype solar cooker that has the ability to cook regardless of sunlight, they will reduce smoke emission by 90% (when compared to other cookers), while turning energy created during the cooking process into electricity. The team will train unemployed youth in the essential skills for constructing the solar cookers and instruct community members on how to properly maintain and use the solar cookers.

### How We Help:

The TerraOak team presented their social venture three times before they were awarded their Resolution Fellowships. During their first presentation, Resolution SVC judges were impressed by their proposal; however, there were concerns regarding technical specifications of the solar cooker. With crucial feedback and suggestions for improvement by our SVC judges during their first and second SVCs, Maxwell, Godwin, and Megan updated their solar box cooker prototype and were awarded their Resolution Fellowships at the 2015 Igniting Innovation Summit.

Maxwell, Godwin, and Megan work closely with their Resolution Guides, Majid Waheed and Michelle Riffelmacher. Majid is a process development engineer at Butamax, and Michelle works as a product relationship manager for Citi. Godwin stated in a recent impact evaluation that “both Guides virtually take this venture as theirs as well. In certain periods we communicate over the phone three times a week. This just goes to prove the level of open communication and feedback.”

# FELLOW SPOTLIGHTS

## Mojia Shen - Revive



### About **the Fellow:**

Mojia Shen, a native of Qinhuangdao, China, is a sophomore at Wellesley College pursuing a double major in economics and psychology. She is the founder of her Resolution-supported social venture, Revive, and is also the co-founder and CEO of Flavory, a web platform that connects unemployed women in Monterrey, Mexico, to sell and deliver their homemade, low-cost cuisine to culinary enthusiasts and consumers. Passionate about women's empowerment, Mojia was chosen as the Chinese delegate for the G(irls) 20 Summit 2015 in Istanbul, Turkey. She is also a serial entrepreneur and founded WeStar, the first entrepreneurship community at Wellesley, to boost the entrepreneurial spirit on campus.

### The Issue and Her **Resolution:**

Mojia's social venture, Revive, provides psychological and emotional support to grieving parents in China who have lost a child. As a result of the national policy, many families in China only have one child; therefore, the loss of that child can be particularly traumatizing. Through Revive, Mojia is providing free counseling services and arranging free health checks for families. Revive is the first nonprofit organization in China to provide free psychological counseling to grieving families and has reached 70 families to date. The Revive team also strives to give back by collecting and redistributing clothes and baby products to orphanages in China.

### How We **Help:**

Resolution has played a crucial role in helping Mojia obtain the necessary resources and support to launch her social venture. Mojia is supported by her two Guides, Mei Tao and Neeral Gandhi. Mei is an investment analyst at International Finance Corporation, and Neeral is a consultant at Oliver Wyman Financial Services. Mojia noted that her Guide, Mei, helped her expand her network and that both Guides have helped her in ways that extend beyond her social venture. In particular, during their Skype sessions Mei recently gave Mojia advice on looking for internships, searching for full-time jobs, and planning for her career in the long term. Mei notes that with Resolution's help, Mojia has grown tremendously as "a more efficient, connected, and global entrepreneur."

## Rebecca Brune - Young Women's Circles Program



### About **the Fellow:**

Rebecca Brune graduated from Nebraska Wesleyan University with a Bachelor of Science in social work. After her Women's Human Rights Program internship with Amnesty International USA, Rebecca continued to be heavily involved in the fight against gender inequality in her community. Rebecca is currently working as a child welfare program associate at Nebraska Appleseed.

### The Issue and Her **Resolution:**

Rebecca is the founder of Young Women's Circles Program (YWCP), a social venture that aims to empower young women and develop potential future leaders. Through weekly dialogue meetings and activities, YWCP's mission is to dissolve gender inequality by helping participants find a deeper sense of self as they break down stereotypes and gain confidence. Recently, YWCP formed a partnership with a nonprofit, Nebraskans for Civic Reform, and has received funding to expand its program to two middle schools in Omaha, Nebraska.

### How We **Help:**

Rebecca works closely with her Resolution Guides, Caty Reid and Susan Golbe, who have helped her develop YWCP in areas such as budgeting, communication, impact evaluation, project design, and branding. Rebecca expressed the importance of her Guides: "Being able to talk through challenges with my Resolution Guides has provided ... insight[s] and new ideas from ... [a] fresh perspective."



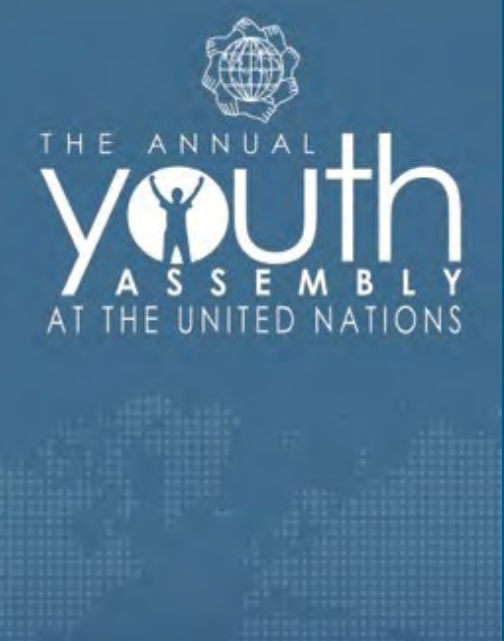


# RESOLUTION SOCIAL VENTURE CHALLENGES

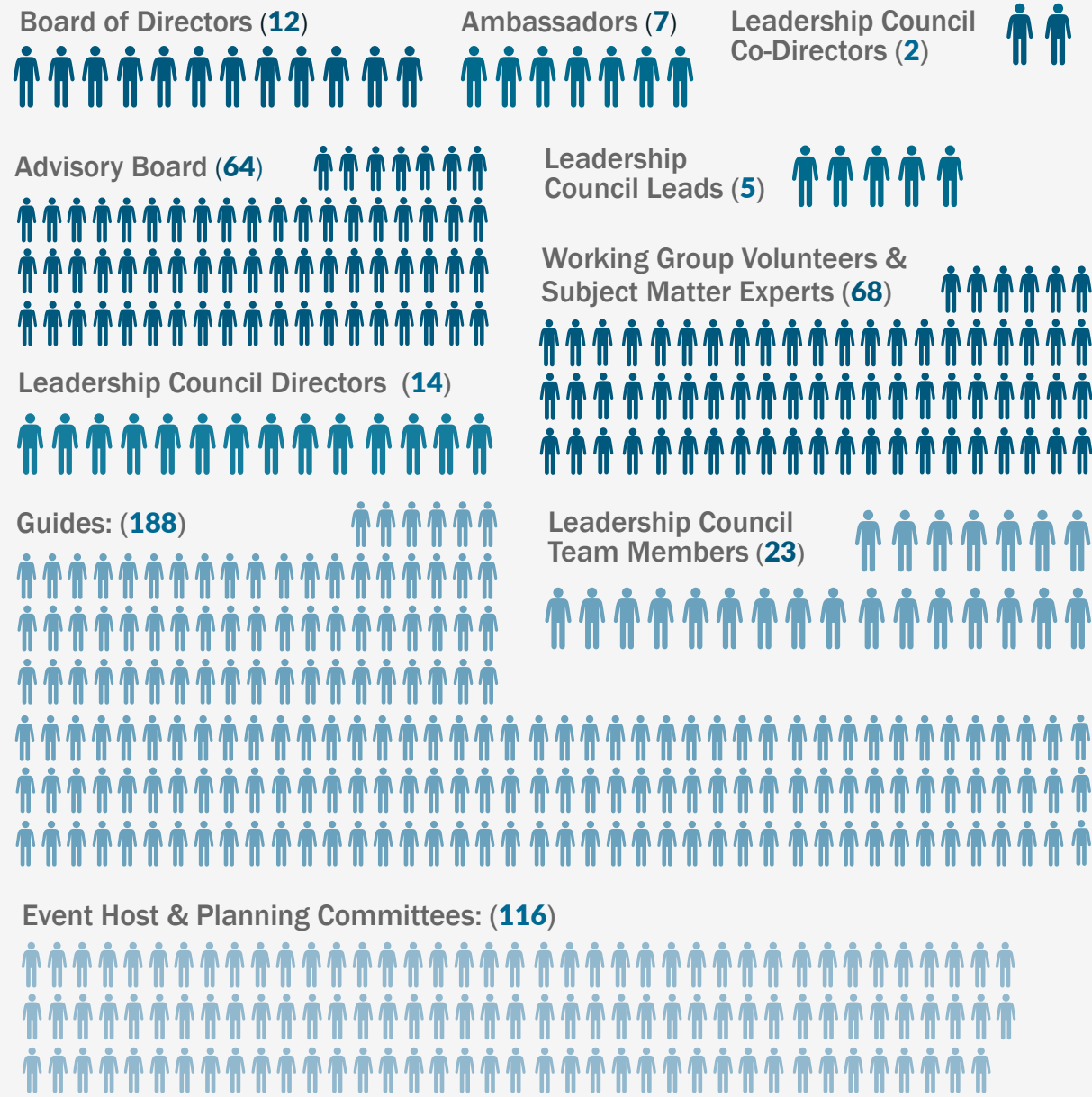

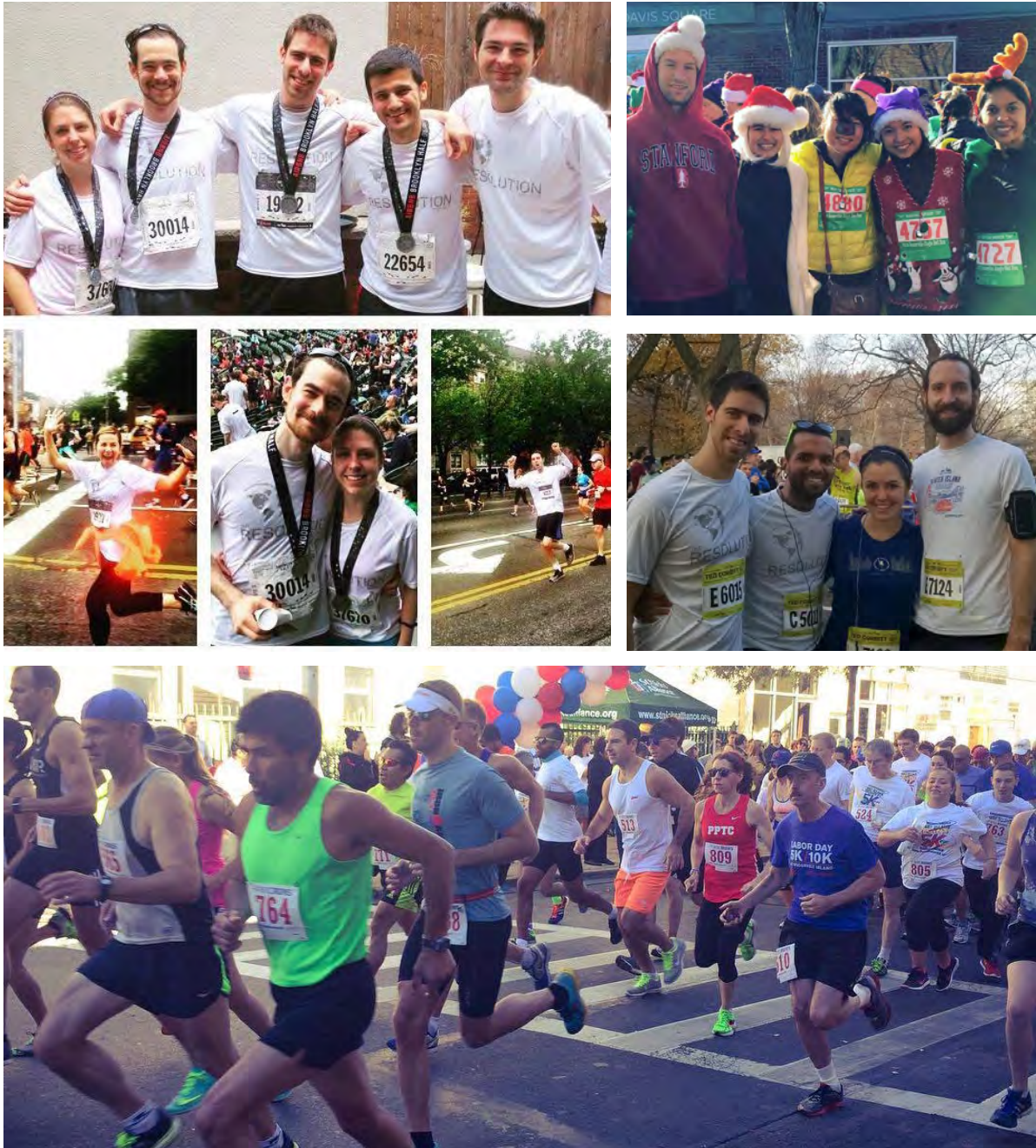


# RESOLUTION RUNS

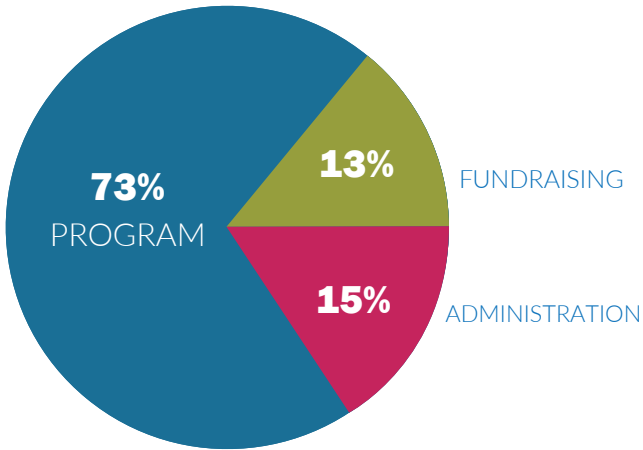

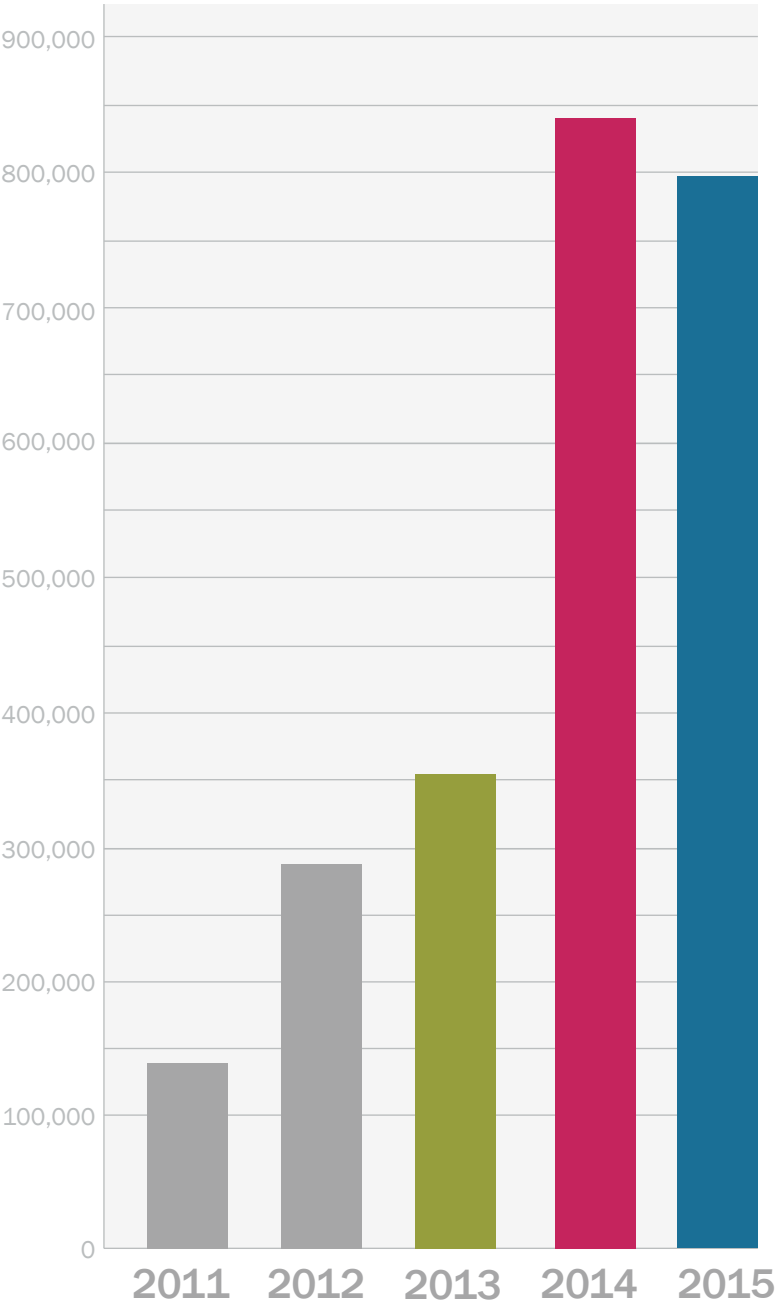
